

FOOD PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS

Starting **June 1, 2024**, Shoreline businesses serving or selling food must replace single-use plastic service ware with reusable items for on-site dining and approved compostable or wood items for takeout and to-go orders.

What are the requirements of the new law?

All food service businesses must use:

- Reusable plates, bowls, cups, utensils, and condiment containers for on-site dining
- Commercially compostable or wood plates, bowls, cups, and utensils for takeout and togo orders

Who has to follow the law?

Any person or place that serves or sells food. This includes, but is not limited to, restaurants, coffee shops, cafes, bars, cafeterias, delis, grocery stores, convenience stores, caterers, vendors at fairs, food trucks, schools, hospitals, and health care facilities.

When does the law go into effect?

June 1, 2024

What products are allowed?

Reusable versions of the following for onsite dining and approved compostable or wood versions for to-go orders:

- Plates
- Bowls
- Cups, lids & cup sleeves
- Knives, forks, spoons & chopsticks
- *Straws & stirrers
- Trays

- Deli containers
- Clamshells & other lidded containers
- Food contact paper
- Portion cups & condiment packets
- Napkins
- Splash sticks

Compostable products must be accepted by Shoreline's composting facility, Cedar Grove, and meet Washington State requirements.

Where can I purchase these products?

Ask your current supplier. Major food distributors carry compostable and reusable products that meet the City's requirements.

Are there exemptions?

There are temporary exemptions for **prepackaged foods, catering trays, clear food wrap and shrink wrap, containers for uniquely shaped foods, and containers or trays for hot meat items among others.

Businesses may apply for a waiver from these service ware requirements if:

- They do not have on-site or off-site dishwashing capacity or
- A suitable compostable product is not commercially available to replace a single-use plastic product
