- Can include funded and unfunded projects

- Projects and programs in the draft TIP includes:
 - Pedestrian
 - Bicycle
 - System Preservation
 - Safety and Operations
 - Traffic and Intersection Improvements
 - Corridor Studies
 - Growth Projects

FUNDED – \$35,804,086

- o Aurora \$27,327, 371
- Road surface maintenance \$5,500,000
- Traffic safety improvements \$1,481,500
- Curb ramp, gutter and sidewalk program \$853,500
- Traffic signal rehabilitation \$641,715

UNFUNDED - \$130,218,580

- —Traffic and intersection \$56,290,520
- —Sidewalks \$35,585,000
- -Growth \$32,540,560
- Bicycle \$4,787,500
- Corridor studies \$1,015,000

- Attachment showing \$1 million/\$2 million per year
- Local Improvement Districts (LIDs)
- Transportation Benefit Districts (TBDs)
- Voter approval
