Acquisition of SPU's Water System

- Council Goal since 2009
- SPU system serves approximately 2/3 of Shoreline
- Total Cost = \$40.8 Million
 - Acquisition = \$26.6 Million
 - Initial Improvements and Separation = \$14.2 Million
 - Acquisition in 2020



Council & Community Goal

Long-term Community Goal:

- Community Vision Statement & the Framework Goals:
 - **FG#2:** Provide high quality public services, utilities, and infrastructure that accommodate anticipated levels of growth, protect public health and safety, and enhance the quality of life.
 - FG#14: Designate specific areas for high density development, especially along major transportation corridors.
- Formal Council Goal since at least 2009

Follow-Up From June 11

- Olympic View Water & Sewer District, Shoreline Water District
 - Post Acquisition: Physical Capacity & Supply Reliability
 - CH2MHill Confirmed City's Post Acquisition System will:
 - Supply the demands of all customers
 - Supply from two places with very high reliability
 - Adequate water for Shoreline and water wheeled to adjoining water districts - "Full Service Requirement Contract" with SPU

SPU Citizen Steering Committee Recommendation

- 21 of 23 committee members recommend that City proceed with acquisition
- Reasons why?
 - Local control, representation, and investment
 - Acquire, operate, and maintain within SPU projected rate structure
 - Enhanced capital reinvestment in Shoreline system
 - Rates and taxes come to Shoreline not Seattle



Seattle Resolution

- Seattle Council Library, Utilities, and Center Committee ("LUC") passed resolution to negotiate purchase-sale agreement
 - Base purchase price expected to be at least \$26.6 million
 - Shoreline assume wheeling agreement responsibilities
 - Southeast Area
- Next step Consideration by entire Seattle City Council



City Manager Recommendation

- Long-term Council goal
- Due Diligence
 - Engineering & Financial Analysis
 - Risk Assessment & Sensitivity Analysis
 - Citizen Committee Recommendation
 - Community Support
 - 79% of Informed Residents Support Acquisition



City Manager Recommendation

- Local accountability and control
- No increase in property taxes
- No increase in projected SPU water rates for Shoreline customers
 - Council condition of acquisition
- Reinvestment in Shoreline
 - 100% of the water rates used for maintenance and infrastructure investment will stay in Shoreline
 - Coordinate improvements to improve commercial districts and increase water flow for firefighting purposes
 - Vision 2029

SPU Acquisition Timeline

- Tonight Council Acquisition Direction
- August 6: Council Actions
 - Ballot language approval
 - Appoint Pro and Con committees
 - Statements in favor and in opposition of ballot measure and rebuttals
- November 2012: Community Vote
- 2013: Seattle/Shoreline Agreement



SPU Acquisition Timeline

- 2013 2019: Continued analysis, initial capital improvements and develop operations plan
 - 2016: Prepare Comprehensive Water Plan
 - 2018: Interim Financing
 - 2018-2019: Separation & Initial Improvements
- 2020: Complete Acquisition Transaction



Council Direction

- Staff is seeking Council direction to:
 - Return on August 6 with ballot language for the Council to adopt for the November ballot
 - Recruit members to serve on a Pro or Con Committee
