Vision



Provide a place for dog owners to enjoy leisure activities similar to other recreational activities in Shoreline's parks and open spaces.

Provide a place where dog owners can socialize together fostering a sense of community.

Promote socialization and health of dogs, responsible dog ownership and reduced violations of the leash law.

Framework Goal 4: Provide a variety of gathering places, parks and recreational opportunities for all ages and expand them to be consistent with population changes.

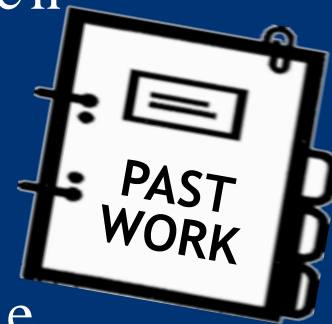
PROS Plan Goals 1, 2, 3: Provide a variety of indoor and outdoor gathering places for recreational and cultural purposes.

Traditional & Timed-Use



Traditional Off-Leash Areas

- dedicated for off-leash use only
- usable during all posted park hours
- Shoreview Park

Timed-Use Off-Leash Areas

- usable only during posted times
- defined schedule to avoid conflicts
- limited design features
- allows for multiple uses of one site
- Saltwater Park - Nov - Mar

The Off-Leash Dog Area Study Group:

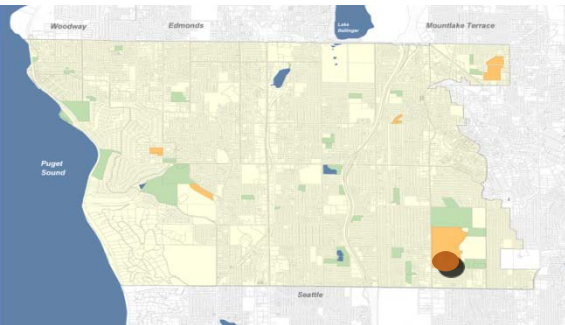
- Met 9 times from Nov 2011 – Jan 2013

Recommended East-Side Site

Southeast Fircrest Field



1760 NE 150th Street
Southeast Corner of
Property along
150th Street

- Approx. 2.0 acres owned by State
- Flat open lawn area with trees
- Easy access and available parking
- Easily modified for traditional fenced off-leash site



Recommended East-Side Site

DSHS Lease Draft Agreement



Terms of Lease Agreement:

City can construct, operate and maintain 2-acre OLDA with 20 parking spaces for:

- \$2,400 annually
- 5-year Term
May 2013-Apr 2018
