Proposed Development Code Amendments Development Code Section 20.50.040, 20.50.050

- 1. Setback Flexibility for Exterior Insulation on Additions to promote energy conservation. Allows 4-inch setback projection and 8-inch height projection for adding exterior insulation to an existing building.
- 2. Setback Flexibility for Rainwater Catchment Systems to promote water conservation. Allows rainwater catchment systems in setbacks subject to size, screening and safety conditions. Systems 600 gallons or less may project to property lines, larger systems must set back 2.5 feet.

Proposed Development Code Amendments Light Pollution Prevention

3. Light Trespass – Requires all new exterior lighting fixtures to be downlit and shielded - affects single-family, multi-family and commercial and mixed use developments.





Development Code Sections 20.50.115, 20.50.205 (new section), 20.50.260.

Proposed Development Code Amendments Sustainable Transportation

- 4. Bicycle Parking short and long term. Development code section 20.50.440. Adds clarity to requirements for long term bike parking; adds requirements for multi-family and commercial development. Specifies design standards.
- 5. Electric Vehicle Charging Stations and Infrastructure. Development code sections 20.50, Multi-family design standards and commercial and mixed use design standards, 20.50.430, parking. Adds requirements for multifamily development (10% of required spaces must be equipped with EV infrastructure). Adds standards for EV space signage.
