Wanted to clarify your question regarding SMC 2.60.090. Here is some information from Ian:

On Councilmember Roberts second point, the language referred to is a limitation on the City Manager's acquisition authority under SMC 2.60.090 ("2.60.090 A . Real Property-Manager's Acquisition Authority."). The Council delegates this authority for lower value real property acquisitions up to \$50,000 if the acquisition is for an approved CIP project, or such higher amount that is specified for acquisition in the CIP, and the purchase is within 10% of our appraisal. Appraisals must be conducted on properties estimated to be over \$25,000.

This section ends with the sentence "All other real property acquisitions will be submitted to the council for approval." The purchase price for The Bog was approved by the Council on 11/26/12 and the County will have signed the purchase and sale contract today. This is the typical situation where the staff has recommended a purchase to the Council as settlement between differing appraisals and the seller's appraisal is more than 10% higher than the City's.
