**CODE INTERPRETATION** 

**CODE SECTION: 20.50.020** 

**ISSUE:** Calculating allowable density

## **DECISION:**

When calculating allowable density, the square footage is divided by 43,560, which is the square footage of an acre. Rounding should not be carried out at this point,\* in order to have as accurate a measurement as possible (\*take to at least seven digits).

For example: a lot size of 10,760 is zoned R-6. 10,760 divided by 43,560 (acre) = .2470156 acres. This figure would <u>not</u> be rounded up to .25, it would remain .2470156, times 6 = 1.4820936 dwelling units. The final rounding is just as outlined in the code; the fraction .4820936 is less than .50, so you round the whole number down to 1 dwelling unit.
