Potluck and Social Time

Council of Neighborhoods members shared food and socialized for the annual holiday potluck from 6:00-7:00 pm.

Human Services Presentations

Chair Atkinson called the meeting to order.

George Smith, Human Services Planner, introduced the two speakers.

Susan Gemmel, Director King County 2-1-1 and the Crisis Clinic described 2-1-1as a statewide database and community information line. The resource line is answered by paid staff that can provide community resource information. Top needs identified by callers: financial assistance (rent and utilities); emergency shelter and housing; food assistance; legal help and holiday help.

Kevin Osborne, Director Hopelink Shoreline explained that the Shoreline Hopelink is one of five Hopelink Service Centers in King County. The primary services they provide: Medicaid transportation; utilities assistance; education (GED, tutoring); employment services; food bank, emergency services (eviction and move in assistance).

Mr. Osborne also provided an overview of the proposed Ronald Commons, a joint project of Ronald United Methodist Church, Compass Housing and Hopelink to build a location for integrated services and provide more space for Hopelink to provide classes and an improved food bank.
