Attached are the narcotic arrest numbers by year, broken out by felony, misdemeanor and investigation. Julie put together the graph. Most drug arrest/charges are search incident to arrest; warrant, traffic arrest, assault, where narcotics are found when the officer makes the physical arrest. A police officer observing a hand to hand transaction and making an arrest are few and far between. Hand to hand transactions are occurring on Aurora, that's one of the reasons SODA will be an effective, preventative tool.
