Here is the response to your second question - this will go in the Green Folder for Monday:

Food Life Line's move, this won't affect food allocation to our local food banks and meal programs. Our funding to them provides for direct purchase of food by Hopelink. Food Life Line is one of two wholesale providers for food banks and meal programs across Western Washington. They have a regional market and we are well within that sphere. As Rob understands it they are consolidating operations in one facility which he presumes is their new shop in SODO. There is a general concern about services moving south in King County. Though we'll lose a major opportunity for volunteers and some visibility we gain by virtue of Food Life Line's location in Shoreline, it shouldn't compromise access to food for Shoreline providers and residents. Hopelink is and will be the primary food bank and distribution site for Shoreline.

We'll get the chart to you on Monday, as staff have been out of the office this week.
