The SEPA EIS Process

An environmental impact statement (EIS) is prepared when the lead agency has determined that a proposal is likely to result in significant adverse environmental impacts.

Determine EIS is Needed (Determination of Significance)

Prepare Supporting Discipline Reports As Necessary

Identify Alternatives and Environmental Elements

Scoping

Scoping provides notice to the public, tribes, and other agencies that an EIS is being prepared, initiates their involvement in the process, and allows them to identify which issues are relevant for the EIS.
