7. Shoreline's elementary schools are currently overcrowded. There are schools that have no rooms available for additional classrooms ... not even closets or pods. In both the 2014 and 2015 school years, specialists had to double up to make classrooms available. Those schools were also forced to move some special programs to schools with space. For some Special Ed students, a change such as switching schools is extremely traumatic. This can easily set students back and can also cause difficult behavioral changes in students. These changes trickle down to Transportation issues as some elementary schools are early start, and some are late start, causing much angst for many students who have difficulty changing their internal clocks and routines. In addition, students ride on bus in a different, unfamiliar part of Shoreline.

This not a time to rezone such a large area and add to the over-crowding. Also, it is not a time to give developers tax breaks that would help fund solutions to these problems.
