Potential amendment to add a sunset provision to the ordinance. I spoke w/ Rachael and given the Sound Transit activity and the need to contact each impacted property owner, correcting the split zone parcels in the City on a zoning map scale may take some time. Thus, Rachael suggested a 2019 sunset date. I have draft two different types of sunset provisions for your selection choice.

Move to Amend Section 2 of Ordinance 722 to include a sunset provision:

Section 2. Publication, and Effective Date, and Sunset Clause. A summary of this Ordinance consisting of the title shall be published in the official newspaper. This Ordinance shall take effect five days after publication. <u>Unless renewed by City Council action, Section 1 of this Ordinance shall automatically expire and terminate three (3) years after its effective date.</u>

OR

Move to Add a new Section, Section 3 of Ordinance 722, to include a sunset provision.

Section 3. <u>Sunset</u>. <u>Unless renewed by City Council action, the provisions implemented by Section 1 of this Ordinance shall terminate at 11:59 pm on December 31, 2019.</u>
