IV. Visiting Councilmember Update

Councilmember Doris McConnell provided updates on business before the City Council including:

- The third and final mile of the Aurora Corridor Project is nearly finished. This 10 year project is on schedule and budget, coming in at \$148 million, with 90% funded by grants, leaving no debt. A celebration is scheduled for December 5th, 9:30 – 11:30 a.m. in City Hall.
- The 145th Street Multimodal Corridor Study Open House on September 30th drew over 200 people. Many completed an exercise, which is now online until October 11th.
