Council Action

I move to adopt ordinance no. 728 adopting the 2016 Budget, 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Plan, Fee Schedule, Salary Schedule, and establish fund appropriations for the 2016 calendar year.

Proposed Amendments Expenditures

I move to amend the 2016 Proposed Budget to appropriate additional one-time funds, as follows:

- 1. \$3,250 for CHS Chrome books for Ballinger Homes OST
- 2. \$15,000 for Hopelink rental assistance program.
- 3. \$4,600 for Hopelink utility assistance program.
- 4. \$16,000 for SLFP Senior Ctr to backfill expiring grant.
- 5. \$10,000 for SLFP Senior Ctr for catering revenues shortfall.
- 6. \$30,000 for a tolling study of Richmond Beach Drive NW

Proposed Amendments

Revenues/ Eliminations/ Reductions

I move to amend the 2016 Proposed Budget with the following one-time changes:

- 1. Increase revenues \$24K for drafting of vegetation mgmt regulations.
- 2. Eliminate \$17K allocation for the micro-filming of payroll records.
- 3. Reduce allocation for PW's on-call professional services by \$20K.
- 4. Reduce the allocation for Promoting Shoreline by \$11,850.
- 5. Eliminate \$20K allocation for professional services support for engaging the business community in exploring a possible B&O Tax.
- 6. Eliminate \$48,327 allocation for professional services for the drafting of vegetation management regulations.

Proposed Amendment

I move to authorize the City Manager or her designee to make the necessary revisions to the 2016 Proposed Budget and other documents.

2016 Property Tax Levy

- Regular Levy (Operations):
 - 2016 Levy: \$10,894,545 = \$1.33 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation
 - 2015 Levy: \$10,617,487 = \$1.43 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation
- Bond Levy (Parks and Open Space): \$1,710,000
 - 2016 Parks Bond Levy Rate = \$0.208 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation
 - 2015 Parks Bond Levy Rate = \$0.232 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation
