> Looking at this amendment: "The applicant shall utilize only government-issued identification such as a State or tribal issued identification card, driver's license, military identification card, or passport from prospective encampment residents to develop a list for the purpose of obtaining sex offender and warrant checks. The applicant shall submit the identification list to the King County Sheriff's Office Communications Center," I have two questions.

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> 1) Should "State" be capitalized? Does a capitalized "State" refers to one State (which could mean only Washington), while an uncapitalized "state" refers to states in general (but must be singular since a state would issue only one ID).

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> 2) What is the purpose of the word "only" in this statement?
