Semi-Annual Clean Sweep Recycling Event

Twice a year, Shoreline residents have the opportunity to participate in a recycling event enabling them to safely dispose of many items that do not qualify for curbside waste pick-up.

Public Works staff in partnership with local agencies and vendors conducts the Clean Sweep Recycling Events. Shoreline residents may bring materials such as bulky items (like old sofas), used batteries, used motor oil/antifreeze, tree branches, scrap metal, and clean scrap lumber. Items such as televisions and computer monitors, various appliances, propane tanks, and porcelain toilets/sinks are also accepted for a fee.

Goodwill is on hand to accept second-hand items in good shape.

Quantity limits and restrictions: For the Seattle facilities and the King County Wastemobile:

- there is a 30 gallon gasoline limit
- no containers can be over 5 gallons in size
- 50 gallons (total) household hazardous waste limit per customer per day
- no more than 10 fluorescent bulbs may be dropped off

For pre-approval for exceptions to these limits, or for disposing of any unusual wastes, contact the Household Hazards Line at (206) 296-4692, Monday through Friday between 9 am and 4:30 pm, except holidays.

Minimum Garbage Fee

The minimum garbage fee is \$17.25 per entry for all vehicles. Passenger cars pay only the minimum. All other vehicles, including station wagons, vans, mini-vans, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, all-terrain vehicles and sport utility vehicles, will be weighed in and out and charged for the actual weight disposed, pro-rated, based on the tonnage rate. The entry fee covers the first 320 pounds.

Methods of Payment

Cash, checks, Visa® or MasterCard® (debit/credit) are accepted.

Recycling Services

Recycling bins are located at all transfer stations except Algona and Factoria. Note: transfer station recycling bins have limited capacity. Excess materials cannot be stored outside of bins. Call the Solid Waste Information Line: 206-296-4466 for assistance with unusually large quantities.

Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping impacts public health and safety, property values, and the quality of life in our community.

What is illegal dumping?

Illegal dumping is the improper disposal of waste. Illegal dumping often occurs on remote roads and in isolated areas. Illegal dumping also happens in and around business and apartment dumpsters, residential property and public property such as parks and greenbelts.

How do I report illegal dumping?

The Customer Response Team investigates calls about illegal dumping on City right of way - garbage that is dumped on the side of the road or on City owned property. Removal of garbage from private property is the responsibility of the property owner. To report illegal dumping call **(206) 546-1700**.
