Dear Council and Planning Committee,

In reading through the full agenda I noted the comment that the DEIS was done in a DRY year with DRY conditions in the wetland areas studied. Given this, does it make sense to move to adopt a plan for rezoning based on what would amount to erroneous information on the wetland areas?

The Paramount Park Open Space should *never* be judged when it is dry, there is a huge change in the stream and wetland when it is raining, which is more common than the dry weather from last year. Before Shoreline became a city a small development many, many years ago on 12th had a huge impact on the park, it effectively destroyed a good portion of the streamflow. So how can basing a rezone on a dry season's DEIS make any sense?

Please take this into consideration. As a resident who has lived with the Paramount Park Open Space since 1982 I can guarantee, assuming what was found last year as a reasonable assessment, isn't.
