This program is currently funded through an annual transfer from the General Fund. It is underfunded, as it is known that additional work is needed to fully maintain the existing								
sidewalks. It is unknown how much additional funding is needed at this time. A full inventory is								
required in order to accurately assess the need and an inventory and condition assessment is funded in the 2015 budget. Additionally, new requirements for curb ramp upgrades associated								
with projects such as traffic signal improvements and pavement overlays continue to increase the								
costs associated with this program. It is estimated this program is less than 50% funded. Future								
TIPs may include this information.


