Introduction

- City Council has long been committed to Financial Sustainability
- City is required to pass a balanced budget
- Residents have a high level of satisfaction with Shoreline's quality of life and levels of service
- Levy Lid Lift to support basic services expires at the end of 2016.

2010 Levy Lid Lift

Shoreline voters approved Proposition 1 to:

- Maintain basic services;
- Restore 2011 levy rate to \$1.48; and,
- Allow 2012-2016 levies to grow by CPI



Paying for City Services

- No Action
 - 1% property tax levy increase limit
- Cost to Provide Basic Services Increases
 More than 1% Annually
 - Revenue needed to pay for basic services doesn't keep pace



Early-November	Staff will contact Assessor's Office to obtain updated AV estimate before Property Tax Levy Resolution is adopted by Council	
Late-November	Council adoption of Property Tax Levy Resolution	
End of November	Receive Final AV from County Assessor	

Levy Lid Lift Renewal

- Reviewed on June 13 and July 11
- Council directed staff to bring forward a proposal for consideration
- Resolution No. 389 proposes to submit a ballot measure for voters to consider
 - Staff recommends adoption with amendments

Changes Since July 11

- Updated estimate on AV
 - Puget Sound Economic Forecaster 3.1%
 - King County Assessor Preliminary 10%
- Evaluation of impact to Revenue & Residents




Levy Lid Lift Renewal: Projection of Impact on Residents – Revised Estimates

Growth returns to statutory 1% + new construction






Strategy 7: Levy Lid Lift Renewal


- Levy Rate Set at \$1.39

Draft Ballot Language

BASIC PUBLIC SAFETY, PARKS & RECREATION, AND COMMUNITY SERVICES MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS LEVY

The Shoreline City Council adopted Resolution No. 389 concerning basic public safety, parks and recreation, and community services. If approved, this proposition would restore Shoreline's levy rate to fund police/emergency protection including neighborhood patrols and crime prevention; preserve safe parks, trails, playgrounds/playfields and the Shoreline pool; and maintain community services including senior center and youth programs.

This proposition would set Shoreline's maximum property tax rate to \$1.48 \$1.39/\$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2017; set the limit factor for 2018-2022 at 100% plus annual inflation (Seattle CPI-U); and use the 2022 levy amount to calculate subsequent levy limits.

Proposed Amendment

Summary

- City is required to pass a balanced budget
- City Councils have been prudent in their financial planning
- Residents have a high level of satisfaction with Shoreline's quality of life
- Residents have a desire to maintain current services
- FSCAC Majority (11 of 13) supported renewal at \$1.48 under original AV growth rate
 - Equivalent to \$1.39 under the revised assessed valuation assumptions
