What are Complete Streets?





Streets that provide safe mobility and access for all users

Shoreline's **Transportation** Master Plan's **Goals and Policies** emphasize a **Complete Streets** approach

Elevation of Shoreline's Complete Streets approach to a codified program will:

- Demonstrate the City's commitment to developing a transportation system that allows for safe and convenient travel of all users
- Create a systematic method for designing Complete Streets
- Allow for the incremental tracking of implemented Complete Streets projects
- Establish eligibility for the Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) Complete Streets Award Program



Proposed Ordinance 755

Would amend Shoreline Municipal Code Title 12 by adding a new Chapter 12.50 that would:

- State City's policy on Complete Streets
- Establish the City's Complete Streets Program
- Define Complete Streets design principles
- Establish exceptions



Exceptions (with Director of Public Work's approval):

- When project would be contrary to public safety
- When cost would be excessively disproportional to need
- Where there is no identified need
- When routine maintenance work doesn't change the roadway geometry or operations
- When project is a limited access roadway
- When project would create problematic transitions on either end

Resource/Financial Impact

- No initial capital cost
- Public Works Dept. will develop and implement a Complete Streets checklist for design review and permitting of City's roads
- Adoption and implementation of a Complete Streets
 Program may satisfy future grant eligibility
 requirements
