Overview



- Cold dry air mass now in place
- Next weather system moving south from the NE Gulf of Alaska
 - Snow to begin on the Olympic Peninsula late tonight and spread SE
 - Snow to spread south thru western Washington Wed morning
 - Weather is terrain driven and will play a key role in how much snow and when
 - Snow to continue into Wed night and taper off by Thu

What's next?

- Another surge of colder air from the interior of western Canada Wednight/Thu
- Continued unseasonably cold but dry Fri and Sat
- Next weather system due by Sunday
- This system has the potential to produce more snow than the Wed system
- Continued cold into next week?

Watch vs Warning vs Advisory

Watch

- The hazardous weather event threat is higher, but still not certain prepare now
- Time period 12-48 hours in advance of event

Warning

- Imminent or occurring take action
- Time period within 12 hours of the event
- Event is hazardous to life and property

Advisory


- Imminent or occurring
- Time period within 12 hours of the event
 - Event is more of an inconvenience vs threat to life and property



Winter Weather Criteria



- Winter Storm Warning (within 12 hours)
 - Lowlands 4" or more
 - Mountains 12" or more
- Winter Weather Advisory (within 12 hours)
 - Lowlands 1-3 inches
 - Mountains 6-11 inches
- Blizzard Warning (within 12 hours)
 - Snow combined with winds of 35 mph or more and visibility of $\frac{1}{4}$ mile or less









Current Watch/Afternoon Update








Afternoon Update to Watch

Tonight

- Increasing clouds
- Threat of snow late Olympic Peninsula
- Not quite as cold 20s





Wednesday

- Snow spreads southeast through western Wa
- Amounts to vary widely
- Mountains 1 to 2 feet
- Lowlands
 - Greatest amounts north and south of central Puget Sound
 3-8 inches
 - Central Puget Sound Trace to 5 inches
 - Coast 1-4 inches
 - Strait 2-4 inches
- Temperatures Low to mid 30s





- Wednesday night
 - Snow to taper off from north to south
 - Amounts again to vary
 - Wind to pick up again out of the Fraser
 - Lows upper teens and 20s





- Thursday and Friday
 - Lingering snow showers ending Thursday
 - Clearing trend
 - Lows generally in the teens
 - Highs generally in the twenties
 - Fraser winds to ease by Friday





- The Weekend
 - Sat looks continued cold and dry
 - Next weather system to arrive Sunday
 - Has potential to produce more snow than the Wed/Wed night system
 - Some moderation in temps Sun
- The Week Ahead
 - Looks to be continued unseasonably cold
 - Stay Tuned !!
