

## 2017 Revenues




# Where Will the Money Come From? Total Budget: \$87.319 Million





# General Fund Operating Revenue \$39.561 Million




### Property Tax – Regular Levy









- Vehicle License Fee
- Real Estate Excise Tax (REET)
- Grants



## Vehicle License Fee

- Currently @ \$20 per year
- \$20 generates \$780K annually




- Council has authority to impose up to an additional \$20
  - \$6 to replace GF Contribution to Roads Cap
  - \$14 Available for other transportation projects

 Used for projects in the Comprehensive Plan, specific public works projects, and debt service
