I understand that it feels good to have a neighborhood name or landmark (like Twin Ponds or Ridgecrest), in the station name, and not to lessen the importance of those places, but it is important to look at station names from the perspective of a visitor - someone who doesn't know the area. Since the 145th Station is on the border of Seattle and Shoreline, it seems like it would be a good idea to somehow indicate that location in the name. I think that an appropriate name for the 145th station could be "Sea-Shore" (Seattle-Shoreline) - along the lines of thinking of SeaTac indicating the airport is between Seattle-Tacoma.

For the 185th station, I would suggest Shoreline Central - Shoreline Center is okay, but the Shoreline Center is a place that may not be in existence in the future. The 185th station isn't really the center of Shoreline, but it is close to the central area.
