

Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements are coming to your street!

In 2013 City of Shoreline employees secured grant funding to construct two east-west connections between the Interurban and Burke Gilman Trails. City staff worked with Lake Forest Park to layout a northern route and a southern route (see attached map).

What is happening on NE 150th St?

The southern route is on NE 150th St from 15th Ave NE to 27th Ave NE. The project will:

- 1. Install on-street **bike lanes** from 15th Ave NE to 25th Ave NE
- 2. Install bike wayfinding signage from 15th Ave NE to 27th Ave NE
- 3. Complete a pedestrian connection on the north side of NE 150th St in front of the dog park
 - a. New asphalt path will be separated from the bike lane by a ditch
- 4. Remove drainage curb from the southern shoulder of NE 150th St between 17th Ave NE and 20th Ave NE, and install an asphalt berm at the edge of pavement to protect roadway runoff from entering private property
 - a. Asphalt berm in front of driveways has been modified to accommodate vehicles

What will construction look like?

Construction impacts include, but are not limited to:

- Disturbances to landscaping and paving within the right-of-way
- Mailbox impacts (not to affect delivery of mail)
- Temporary loss of two-way traffic (all work to be completed between the hours of 9am-3pm)

Construction is currently scheduled to begin this May
