








Operating Revenues by Source




Operating Revenue Comparison




Operating Budget Expenditures by Function \$49.039 Million

- Proposed Amendment 1 (Mayor Roberts)
 - Increase General Fund allocations by including \$11,500 to join the US Conference of Mayors and associated travel costs.

Proposed Amendment 2 & 3

- Proposed Amendment 2 (Councilmember Salomon)
 - Reduce the General Fund appropriations by \$80,000 by eliminating the Salmon Safe Certification program.
- Proposed Amendment 3 (Councilmember Salomon)
 - Amend Fee Schedule 3.01.015 Transportation Impact Fees by reducing fees by 0.4%.
