



Biennial Expenditure Comparison







Biennial Expenditure Comparison





- Primary Revenue Source: Surface Water Utility Fee
- 2019 Single Family Home Rate = \$246.55/yr
 - \$32.16 (+15%) annual change from 2018 to 2019








