Subject: Letter of Concurrence: North & South Jackson Park and Rides and North-Bound I-5 Flyer Stop

Dear Bill:

As part of Sound Transit's Lynnwood Link Extension project, Sound Transit will be closing two park and ride lots and the north-bound I-5 Flyer Stop near NE 145th starting in January 2019. The purpose of this letter is to provide Sound Transit with concurrence from King County Metro on the mitigation for impacts to Metro's riders. Since WSDOT is the owner of both park and ride lots and the Flyer Stop, this letter also serves as notice to WSDOT that Metro and Sound Transit mutually agree on the mitigation.

Park and Ride and Associated Bus Stop Closures

- North Jackson Park & Ride @ 14711 5th Ave NE, Shoreline 98155
 - The following routes serve this P&R: 301, 303, 304, 308, 347, 373, 512
 - o 68 spaces at 94% utilization as of the third guarter of 2016
- South Jackson Park & Ride @ 5th Ave NE and NE 133rd St
 - o No Transit Service to the P&R lot. Carpool and vanpool parking only.
 - o 46 spaces at 13% utilization as of the third quarter of 2016
- North Bound I-5 Flyer Stops @ I-5 and NE 145th St
 - o The following routes serve this Flyer Stop: 301, 303, 512, 308, 304, 661

The following mitigation is based on the Metro's 2017-2018 analysis of potential parking alternatives within proximity to the North Jackson Park and Ride and bus routes (Attachment). In consultation over the past year, Metro and Sound Transit staff have identified and agree upon the following action items as representing all mitigation necessary to minimize the impacts to Metro and its riders regarding the closing of the two park and ride lots and flyer stop. Sound Transit will provide the following:

Alternative Temporary Park and Ride

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- Lease temporary alternate site: a minimum of 68 parking stalls will be secured for interim use as park and ride spaces from the Shoreline Unitarian Universalist Church and/or Phillippi Presbyterian Church located on 1st Ave NE and N 148th St.
- o Ensure the leased parking provides one ADA-accessible space per 25 stalls.
- Provide pedestrian improvements along the east side of 1st Ave NE between NE 145th St and N 148th St for Park and Ride users traveling to and from the churches and bus stops on N 145thSt. Improvements include striping, pavement repair, and signage to clearly delineate pedestrian usage.
- No mitigation for Metro users is needed for South Jackson Park and Ride
- Timing and notice
 - O All pedestrian improvements at the alternative park and ride site(s) and along the east side of 1st Ave NE between NE 145th St and N 148th St will be completed prior to closing of the North Jackson Park and Ride.
 - Sound Transit will provide at least 30 days notice to King County Metro prior to closure of the North and South Jackson Park and Rides.
 - Sound Transit contractors may commence construction at the North and South Jackson Park and Rides immediately after the 30 day notice period.
 - Sound Transit may terminate the alternative temporary park and ride, upon opening of the Shoreline South/145th St station and after providing at least 30 days notice to King County Metro; or, upon mutual agreement between Sound Transit and King County Metro.

By signing this letter, King County Metro concurs with its contents and understands Sound Transit will enter into leases with the churches to secure the identified number of parking spaces for interim park and ride use, and that Sound Transit will insert special conditions into the agreement with its contractor, consistent with this letter of concurrence.

Sound Transit greatly appreciates the time and effort put forth by King County Metro in helping identify alternative parking options while we plan for the building of Lynnwood Link Extension.

The Lynnwood LINK Extension

With the upcoming link light rail construction along I-5 for the Lynnwood Link extension, Sound Transit will be closing two P&R lots and three stop near NE 145th Street for several years. The following closures will be made when construction along this corridor beings after the Sept. 2017 Metro Service Change.

Park & Ride and Bus Stop Closures

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 - o 68 spaces at 94% utilization as of the third quarter of 2016
- South Jackson Park & Ride @ 5th Ave NE and NE 133rd St
 - No Transit Service to the P&R lot. Carpool and vanpool parking only.
 - o 46 spaces at 13% utilization as of the third quarter of 2016
- Stop ID Number
 - o #75882 served by routes 301, 303, 304, 308, 661
 - o #2158 served by routes 512
 - #75883 served by routes 304, 308

Route and Rider Impacts


Folks who use the North Jackson Park & Ride to access I-5 express routes will no longer be able use the North Jackson Park & Ride when construction begins. The above flyer stops will be closed, but the express routes that serve these stops will continue to serve NE 145th using bus stops that can be accessed from the 5th Avenue NE general traffic off and on ramps.

An alternative to take routes 301 and 303 along the 5th Ave NE corridor between NE 145th St and NE 175th in the northbound direction was considered, but upon running a deviation analysis as required by Metro's Service Guidelines, this alternative routing did not meet the deviation guideline requirement. Therefore, these two routes will continue to use I-5 between NE 145th St and NE 175th.


Previous users of the North Jackson Park & Ride will need to use alternative Park & Rides – the Shoreline or Northgate P&R may be viable alternatives for the interim. There is also an effort underway to identify possible leased lot Park & Ride options that could mitigate the impact of closing the North Jackson Park & Ride lot. Potential options include:

- Shoreline Unitarian Universalist Church and/or the Church of Christ these two churches have parking lots @ 1st Ave NE and N 148th St approximately 800 feet from NE 145th Street where there is a Route 304 stop pair just east of 1st Ave NE. If one or both of these leased lot options were to be pursued, the following two items would need to be addressed.
 - Pedestrian Facilities along the 1st Ave NE pathway between NE 145th St and NE 148th St are currently inadequate. Parking restrictions along the east side of the street would need to be implemented, as well as a continuation of the pedestrian sidewalk between NE 145th St and NE 148th St (a photo of this is on page 5).
