Discussing Ordinance No. 866 –
To Authorize a Bond Measure for the Shoreline Aquatics, Recreation and Community Center (ShARCC) and Optionally Priority Park Improvements



School District commitment

On July 15th the School Board adopted School District Resolution 2019-14. Pursuant to that Resolution the School District will:

- Contribute \$2.43 million to the construction of the ShARCC
- Predicated on
 - An eight lane pool
 - Ample capacity for spectators for swim and dive competitions
 - Pool depth sufficient to support the dive teams
 - Preferred scheduling for School District swim and dive team practices and meets for 50 years
 - The District pays no use or maintenance fees for 50 years

Council Direction from June 24th

Council directed staff to prepare two versions of Ordinance No. 866.

- Alternative 1 (Attachment A) includes only the ShARCC
- Alternative 2 (Attachment B) includes the ShARCC and other priority parks improvements
- Both Alternatives reduce the bond amount by the proposed school district contribution of \$2.4 million



Council Direction from June 24th continued

- Flexibility to Support Other Parks Improvements with savings
- More clarity in the ballot title on what is the intent
- Retaining some flexibility in the Ordinance and Explanatory Statement.
- Using funds for other PROS Plan projects would require approval by the sitting City Council.
 - Alternative 1 (Attachment A ShARCC only): the ballot measure title is clear that the funding is intended for the ShARCC only, with no dedicated funding for other PROS plan projects.
 - Alternative 2 (Attachment B ShARCC+) ballot measure title provides funding for both the construction of the ShARCC and the priority parks improvements.

- Hillwood: Multi-sport court, expanded play area with adventure features, splash-pad, picnic shelter, landscaping, perimeter trail



Briarcrest (Hamlin): enhance entrance, play area, splash-pad, community garden, picnic shelter, great lawn

Alternative 1 - Proposed Ballot Title (Attachment A – ShARCC Only)

• This proposition authorizes the City to acquire property and construct an aquatic and community center for senior, youth, family and community activities, including classrooms, a commercial kitchen, recreation/lap pools, two-court gymnasium, exercise space, indoor walking/jogging track, and outdoor active spaces; issue up to \$85,700,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 20 years to finance and refinance such projects; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay such bonds, as provided in Ordinance No. 866.



Alternative 2 - Proposed Ballot Title (Attachment B – ShARCC + Parks)

• This proposition authorizes the City to acquire property and construct an aquatic and community center for senior, youth, and family activities, including classroom/exercise space, recreation/lap pools, gymnasiums, indoor walking/jogging track, and a commercial kitchen; construct park amenities, playgrounds, splash-pads, and/or trails in parks; issue up to \$103,600,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years to finance and refinance such projects; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay such bonds, as provided in Ordinance No. 866.

- Council will be asked to appoint the Pro and Concommittees on August 5, 2019.
- General Election November 5, 2019.

Councilmember Roberts – Proposed Amendment B.2

 I move to amend Ordinance No. 866 as presented as Attachment B, so that the Ordinance includes construction of the Shoreline Aquatics, Recreation and Community Center and priority park improvements for Brugger's Bog Park, Hillwood Park, James Keough Park and development of trails throughout the park system and would authorize issuance of up to \$100,300,000 of general obligation bonds for these improvements.



Alternative 2 - Proposed Ballot Title (Attachment B: Amendment B-1)

• This proposition authorizes the City to acquire property and construct an aquatic and community center for senior, youth, and family activities, including classroom/exercise space, recreation/lap pools, gymnasiums, indoor walking/jogging track, and a commercial kitchen; construct park amenities, playgrounds, splash-pads, and/or trails in parks; issue up to \$103,600,000 \$93,600,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years to finance and refinance such projects; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay such bonds, as provided in Ordinance No. 866.









