MEET WASHINGTON'S First SALMON-SAFE CITY

On Earth Day 2019, the City of Shoreline was recognized as the first Salmon-Safe city in Washington State. Certification followed an 18-month citywide assessment by Salmon-Safe's independent science team. Salmon-Safe recognized Shoreline's regional leadership in preventing water pollution and improving the health of Puget Sound and its salmon and orca populations.

WHAT IS SHORELINE DOING TO BE SALMON-SAFE AND HELP PROTECT PUGET SOUND?

Protecting water quality and wildlife through Salmon-Safe parks practices, including pesticide-free parks.

Reducing stormwater pollution through green stormwater infrastructure projects, including bioswales, rain gardens, and permeable pavement.

Rigorous stormwater management requirements for all new developments with incentives for "beyond compliance" development practices.

Preventing water pollution through water quality testing and resident education regarding water pollution prevention.

Protecting water quality through restricting the use of uncoated zinc and copper for any new building cladding.

Completing pilot projects to provide stormwater management benefits and create urban habitat.

Conserving water through high-efficiency irrigation controls and other conservation practices.

Utilizing Salmon-Safe **zero sediment** runoff construction practices.
