7. I strongly support the acquisition of property to support a future community and aquatics center. Data shows a demographic shift in Shoreline, with increasing numbers of young families such as mine looking for an increase in recreation services, suggesting a higher likelihood of support for a measure over time.  
  
In that future, having property secured would remove a common objection I observed during the 2019 Prop 1 debate. Many opposition comments focused on the total cost, with property acquisition - as opposed to rebuild in-place - a point of focus (and confusion).  
  
With the purchase closed, the construction site will be a settled matter for a future proposition. Even better, the cost to acquire will not rise over time; meanwhile, the presumed higher tax base (based on current infill development trend) could make the per capita cost lower when the facility construction is proposed again.
