With these goals in mind we would like to lend our support to "Amendment 3" which would and I quote,

*"Within the City's commercial areas, mixing of land uses is encouraged to bring shops, services, and offices in close proximity to residential uses. The purpose is to permit those uses which are intended to provide goods and services for the everyday needs of the immediate neighborhood rather than serve the broader nearby communities, and which generally conform to the Comprehensive Plan of the City.*

*Multifamily residential uses are permitted, provided the multifamily residential use is part of a mixed-use building or is on property that has commercial uses. Multifamily residential development without commercial uses on the property shall not be permitted."*

Thank you for taking the needs of the Shoreline Business community in mind as you review this Amendment's addition to the 2020 Comprehensive Plan Docket and we hope that you will move forward in adopting it into the Shoreline City Planning Code when it comes to a vote.
