I am fine with the fees not fully covering the cost of the parking management program. I do not see the intent of the parking enforcement program as a way to penalize people who park. I see it as a way to provide a service to residents and businesses by ensuring that parking is available to serve residents, guests, and customers. Just as with CRT, providing this service to our community is something that we can and should spend general revenues on as needed. That said, making it easy to keep the fees up to date so that we can manage the level of cost recovery seems efficient to me. Thanks,
