- March 27 Federal CARES Act appropriated \$2 trillion in funding for COVID response
- Relief Funds included in CARES Act can be used for medical, public health, payroll, COVID-related, and economic support expenses
- April 27 State of WA awards \$300 million in Relief Funds to local governments through Dept. of Commerce
- Shoreline will receive \$1,691,000 in Relief Funds; must be spent by October 31
- Must enter into Interagency Agreement with Dept. of Commerce to receive funds

Relief Funds – Program Funding and Implementation Plan

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\$981,100 - City direct COVID-19 Response

\$410,000 - Small Business Support Program

\$300,000 - Human Services Support Program

\$1,691,000 - Total



- Covers \$981,000 in City costs of responding to COVID-19 Emergency
- City expenditure reimbursement examples include:
 - City payroll expenses and paid leave expenses for COVID response
 - Expenses for additional disinfection of public areas and facilities and purchase of PPE
 - Modification to City buildings for employee and public safety
 - Telework expenses
 - Portion of COVID-19 Community Response Grant Program
 - Business outreach and communication



Small Business Support Program

- \$500,000 City-administered grant fund
- \$410,000 CARES Act Relief Funds; \$90,000 King County funding
- Grant awards up to \$20,000; partial grants could also be awarded
- Grant applications reviewed by staff; recommendation to the City Manager who will award
- Grant recipients required to enter into a Grant
 Agreement with the City

Small Business Support Program

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Eligibility Criteria

- Fewer than 25 employees
- In business since July 1, 2019
- Physical location within Shoreline in a commercial zone
- Experienced a loss of income due to COVID-19
- Business in good standing

Evaluation Criteria

- Quality of recovery plan
- Focus on serving general consumer categories, such as dining, entertainment, beauty services, etc.
- Independent business
- Number of jobs at risk

Historically marginalized/underrepresented business



Small Business Support Program

- Eligible Business Expenses
 - Payment of rent or required monthly loan payments
 - Payments of regular wages, taxes, and typical benefits to employees
 - Payment for personal protective equipment (PPE), sanitizer, disinfectant, or other supplies, equipment or physical changes in relation to the COVID-19
 - Typical operating costs and expenses
 - Typical draw or wages on a regular interval to owner

Small Business Support Program Next Steps

- Issue press release June 9
- Application available online June 12
- Application deadline June 22
- Applications reviewed by staff June 23-30.
- Recommendations to the City Manager July 1
- Grant award notices to businesses and grant agreements entered into – early July
- Grant award checks mailed mid-July



Human Services Support Program

Food Support Program	Funding Amount
Shoreline School District Summer Sack Lunch and Breakfast Program – supports staffing cost for distribution at four sites	\$10,000
Food Voucher Program – provides up to 468 families access up to \$320 in additional food support over the summer	\$150,000
Shoreline-Lake Forest Park Senior Center Meal Delivery Program - covers meal provision through the end of the year	\$25,000
Total	\$185,000

- Additional \$115,000 for unplanned expenses related to PPE and COVID-19 related cleaning supplies and activities
- Reimbursement to our agency partners
- Expenditures since March 23rd are eligible
- Total of \$300,000 for Food Support Program and partner agency PPE and COVID-19 related support
