If the colors were reversed and black adults were threatening a white teenage girl you would do something. White adults are threatening a black teenage girl ... DO SOMETHING.

I am a white woman who has lived in Shoreline for nearly 40 years. I raised my three biracial daughters here. My experience of Shoreline was drastically different from the experiences of my daughters, who grew up, left, and will never return because of the racism they experienced here. Shoreline Schools provided a hellish experience for them. They learned every slur imaginable there. The Shoreline Police were horrible to them. As an example: The police would regularly follow and solicit my daughters on their walks home from school trying to catch them engaging in prostitution. They were only 14 - 15 years old and their walk form the high school to our home was only a block long, yet the predator cops targeted them. The city itself was racist: We sat in restaurants here and waited in vain to be served, just to be ignored for the audacity of being a multi-colored family. 20 years later and this city is MORE racist than it was. Adults in our city are committing hate crimes against children and this is wrong. I am paying you well to do your jobs justly. Now do them.
