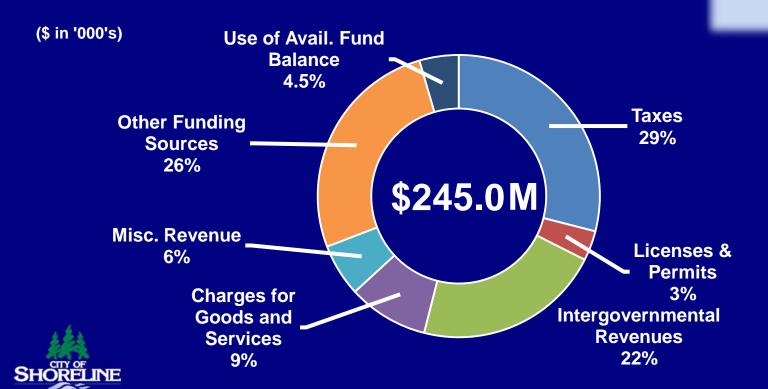

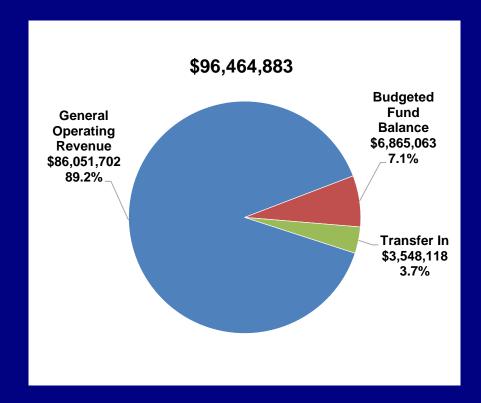

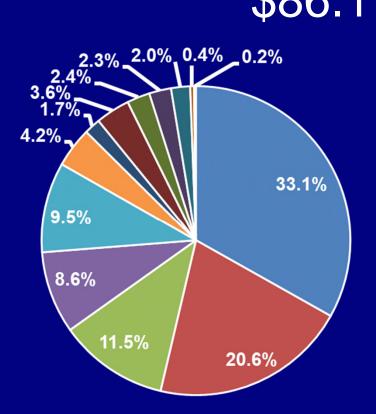
- Regular Levy: \$14.2M

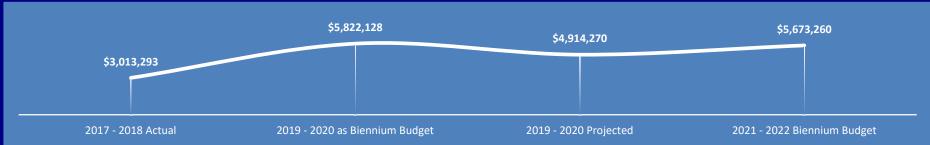
