Healthy Washington Plan – Phase 1:

- Governor Inslee's new two-phase system began today.
- The state is divided into regions with every region starting at Phase 1.
- Our region is made up of King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties.
- To move to Phase 2, regions must meet 4 criteria:
 - 10% decrease in two-week rate of new COVID cases
 - 10% decrease in two-week rate of new COVID hospital admissions
 - ICU occupancy of less than 90% (both COVID and non-COVID cases)
 - COVID-19 test positivity rate of less than 10%.

Phase 1 restrictions and allowances:

- Indoor gatherings are prohibited
- Outdoor gatherings limited to 10 people from two households
- Restaurants and bars
 - Closed for indoor service
 - Restricted outdoor dining, to-go service and delivery allowed
- Retail, grocery stores & personal services – 25% occupancy limit
- Entertainment, fitness facilities and gyms - extremely limited.
- Outdoor sports limited to intra-team practice and all, including athletes, must wear face coverings
- Indoor spiritual and religious services must limit capacity.
- Non-essential travel to other states or counties should be avoided.


Recreation in Shoreline:

- Playgrounds are now open
 - Equipment is not sanitized, please wash/sanitize hands frequently
 - Follow the current social distancing guidelines
- Community garden sheds are open:
 - One person in the shed at a time
 - Sanitize tools before returning to sheds
- Shoreline tennis/pickleball courts have reopened
 - Continued access is dependent on users following social distancing and mask requirements
- **Face masks are REQUIRED for everyone ages 5 and up and RECOMMENDED for everyone ages 2-4**


King County Positive COVID-19 Case Trends

Take prevention measures:

FUTURE PHASES

- High-risk healthcare workers in health care settings
- High-risk first responders
- Long-term care facility residents
- All other workers at risk in health care settings

- All people **70 years or older**
- All people **50 years or older** in multigenerational households (home where individuals from 2 or more generations reside such as an elder and a grandchild)

- High-risk critical workers **50 years or older** who work in certain congregate settings: Agriculture; food processing; grocery stores; K-12 (educators & staff); childcare; corrections; prisons, jails or detention centers; public transit; fire; law enforcement

- People **16 years or older** with 2 or more co-morbidities or underlying conditions

- High-risk critical workers **under 50 years** who work in certain congregate settings (as noted in B2)
- People, staff, and volunteers in congregate living settings: Correctional facilities; group homes for people with disabilities; people experiencing homelessness that live in or access services in congregate settings

- Information on who is eligible for Phases 2, 3 & 4 coming soon.

FOCUS ON EQUITY: This approach prioritizes population groups that have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 due to external social factors and systemic inequities.

The timelines represented here are estimates and subject to change.
