If I may recommend the new residents of the roughly 475 Shea Apartment (phase 1 & 2) units and the surrounding community would be much better served by the existing green belt. A sterling example is the Echo Lake Apartments. which enjoy low density neighbors R-6 to the east, Inter Urban trail, and a lake outside their windows.
