## Shoreline Planning Commission:

I have been a resident of Shoreline for 37 years and have seen the continued degreening and increased radical changes in the kind of community I bought into. Friendly, inviting neighborhoods have become less of a priority as has a thriving green environment. We need to protect that.

Therefore, I strongly urge the Commission to deny the rezoning proposal for 192nd St. west of the Park and Ride for the following reasons:

- 1. The trees provide a buffer from the sounds on Aurora to the homes on Firlands Way and give those homes a peasant "backyard" screen.
- 2. The stand of trees are necessary to contain the soil from erosion in this wet climate.
- 3. The trees provide a necessary canopy to replenish our air with oxygen.
- 4. Old trees take decades to replace.
- 5. With limited access to this site, there will be gridlock. Traffic will be horrendous.
- 6. There is already a large apartment complex being built by Shea on Aurora just south of the Park and Ride. Why is more necessary?

At my home on Firlands Way, I have had to deal with dirt and silt being washed down my driveway over the years and clogging the drain in front of my garage.
