RESIDENTIAL SECURITY CHECKLIST

This information can be a guide to check your home for certain safety measures. These suggestions may show you where you could take action to improve your home's security and help decrease the likelihood that your home is targeted for a crime.

Exterior Doors/Locks	Yes	No
Doors are metal or solid hardwood (these materials offer the best protection). *If your door is made out of something other than these materials, consider an upgrade.		
Strike plates on the door are secured with 4 screws that are at least 2.5 inches long.		
Sliding doors have an anti lift device, such as screws in the upper track, a dowel in the lower track, or a pin lock installed.		
* Key locks not recommended as they may prevent exit in the event of a fire.		
Doors are locked even when at home and inside the residence.		
When leaving for a weekend or vacation, garage door opener is disconnected and a lock is used to secure the garage.		
Garage door is never left open while unattended.

RESIDENTIAL SECURITY CHECKLIST



Lighting - a great crime prevention tool!	Yes	No
When away, interior lights are on a timer to give the impression that someone is home.		
Motion sensor lights directed toward entrances and areas you are trying to protect.		
House numbers are illuminated so they are visible from the street at night.		
Exterior lighting is checked to ensure it doesn't create shadows from shrubs, trees, and vehicles which can inadvertently create hiding spots.		
Miscellaneous Security	Yes	No
Outside valuables (bikes, lawn mowers, grills, etc.) are secured in a locked shed when not in use.		
All valuables that are deemed to be irreplaceable are secured in a safe or safety deposit box off site.		
Complete or update a home inventory by documenting all seiral numbers and taking photos of valuable items such as televisions, tablets, guns, computers, etc.		

SHORELINE WATCH

Joining or initiating a Shoreline Watch group is another way to supplement the security of your home. Getting to know your neighbors, learning who lives in neighborhood, which people live where and who drives which cars is one way to recognize suspicious activity. Neighbors can share phone numbers and email addressess to keep in contact so that everyone knows what is happening in the community.
