
Discussion of Ordinance No. 933: Authorizing the Use of Eminent Domain for Acquisition of Certain Real Properties to Construct the NW Innis Arden Way Culvert Replacement Project



June 14, 2021

- Eminent domain is a power granted to political subdivisions, such as the City of Shoreline, through RCW 8.12 to acquire private property for a public use.
  - RCW 8.25.290 (c) A city or town or other entity subject to chapter 8.12 RCW takes a final action authorizing condemnation as provided in RCW 8.12.040.
- The condemnation ordinance is a precautionary
  step to keep the project on schedule.

- Authorizes condemnation
  - Ability to take all steps needed to acquire property for the project
- Finding of Public use and necessity
  - Property is necessary for the construction of the project
- Compensation
  - City will provide just compensation to property owners





- City has been in contact with all property owners
  - Objective is to negotiate with property owners
  - No eminent domain until negotiation efforts are exhausted
- Includes 3 parcels in Shoreline
  - Only properties downstream of the existing culvert
  - Easements secured upstream/Hidden Lake adjacent

- A notice of the final action, adoption of Ordinance No. 933, has been published in the Seattle Times on May 31<sup>st</sup> and again on June 7<sup>th</sup>.
- A notification letter has been sent via certified mail on May 27<sup>th</sup> to every property owner impacted by the final action.
