I am reiterating my request from November 16, 2020 (copied below) to request funding to complete the 160 feet of sidewalk on 200th street.

Having picked up my children from Cascade K-8, I can attest to the danger facing pedestrians as the sidewalk ends.

Although a line was painted, that has worn down over time. Especially on dark, dreary days (our safety patrol doesn't finish up til nearly four p.m.) pedestrians are not easily visible. There's no room for error on the driver's behalf, especially if a car makes a wide turn eastbound onto 200th.

I request that each council member walk this route on a rainy 4pm with a small child in tow and see how safe it feels.
