- 1 support the proposed speed limit reductions as proposed in Ordinance #950. The gains in safety for all modes of traffic car drivers/passenger, pedestrians, bicyclists, and other personal mobility devices greatly outweighs the very minor inconvenience of cars having a 5 mph slower maximum speed in the affected streets. As the study shows, most of the car already travel within the proposed speed limits. It is also likely that the affected streets have only a few segments where the maximum speed can be reached normally and safely, with the rest having turns, intersections, and crosswalks where lowered speed maximums already apply.
