Attention Council:

During your strategic planning workshop on March 4-5, please keep in mind all the urgent messages from numerous citizens who want you to save the 5th AVE NE trees. Thank you for reconsidering the Rodarte Contract and delaying as long as you can. The Tree Preservation Code Team and Save Shoreline Tree citizen groups have enumerated the concerns very well as follows:

- **"Review the designs for the [new sidewalk program](#) that are in progress now. *Concerns of citizens and Save Shoreline Trees.***

We support sidewalks, but not the proposed width of sidewalks along residential streets.

- Immediate: the new sidewalk project at 5th Ave NE between NE 175th and NE 182 Ct.
- Immediate: the new sidewalk project at 20th Ave NW, between NW 190th and NW 195th St.
- In planning: the new sidewalk project along Westminster Way N from N 145th to N 153rd."

I concur with the above statements in their entirety. In addition please review my previous letters to you the Council, submitted on February 28, 2022, regarding my concerns for the proposed sidewalk designs and loss of 17 healthy northwest native conifers and my support to the TCPT protective tree code amendments.
