






Self Initiated Activity





Response Times 2021







Hate Crimes 2021

- 1/12/2021- Business- The owner called to report swastikas found on the building.
- 4/5/2021- House- Threats to homeowner along with racial slurs. Suspect arrested for hate crime
- 8/8/2021- Business- Victim punched by a suspect who was using racial slurs. The suspect was arrested for a hate crime.
- 9/19/2021- House- Violation of Court Order due to hate crime case from 4/5/21.
- 9/30/2021- Business- Bomb threat and racial slurs made over the phone.
- 11/7/2021- City street- Uber driver assaulted by customer/suspect. Suspected to be racially/ethically motivated.
- 11/22/2021- Neighbors- Suspect maliciously harassed his African American neighbor, then assaulted his roommate with a piece of firewood. The suspect was arrested for a hate crime.
- 12/27/2021- Neighborhood- Threats call on neighbor's friend who punched victim's car and pointed a handgun at him while calling him racial slurs.




Burglaries 2021








Traffic – Collisions and Citations 2021








2020 and 2021 Traffic Ticket Analysis by Race

Police initiated (On-View) traffic stops

- In 2020, of the people licensed in Shoreline who were identified as Black and were cited, eight (8) of the 22 citations are considered "crimes of poverty," such as defective equipment, failing to renew an expired registration, failing to transfer the title, or driving without insurance or a valid driver's license.
- In 2021, of the people licensed in Shoreline who were identified as Black and were cited, two (2) of the eight (8) citations are considered crimes of poverty.





RADAR (Response Awareness De-Escalation and Referral)

The North Sound RADAR Navigator Program combines information sharing across law enforcement agencies and outreach by Mental Health Professional Navigators, serving the cities of Bothell, Kenmore, Kirkland, Lake Forest Park and Shoreline. When law enforcement officers encounter someone with behavioral health symptoms or developmental disabilities in the field, RADAR Navigators can respond to provide crisis de-escalation, outreach, and referral to services. Navigators focus on moving people into community-based and long-term systems of care to reduce reliance on the crisis and criminal legal systems and improve people's lives.
