- Vote **YES** to approve <u>Amendment 3</u>, to complete the inventory of <u>public street trees</u> in 2023. Budget \$200,000.
- **invoke** <u>RCW 36.70A.390</u> to place a moratorium on the removal of <u>public trees</u> for the duration of <u>Climate Emergency Resolution 494</u>.
