Hi Chris,

You asked for an update on the status of rental protections being considered at the state level. As you know, yesterday, March 8, was the cutoff date for bills to be voted out of their chamber of origin. Two tenant protection bills had survived the original committee cutoff:

- HB 1389, which would place limits on the landlord's ability to increase rent, and
- HB 1124, which would increase notice requirements and limit late fees.

Two other bills had been shelved earlier in the session:

- SB 5435, a companion bill to HB 1389, and
- HB 1388, which would apply the Consumer Protection Act to the Residential Landlord Tenant Act, although some aspects of the bill were merged into HB 1389.

Unfortunately, neither of the remaining bills advanced out of the House prior to cutoff. While bills that are considered "Necessary to Implement the Budget" (NTIB) can be resurrected after cutoff, neither of these bills seem to fall into that category.

Accordingly, at this time, there appears to be no further legislative activity that addresses tenant protections.
