


Drivers of Housing Choice



HB 1110 – Middle Housing

- Middle housing is coming to Shoreline
- Allow at least 2 units per residential lot
- Allow at least 4 units per residential lot if:
 - ¼ mile of a major transit stop
 - At least one unit affordable for 50 years
- Compliance 6-months after Comprehensive
 Plan update

- Duplex
- Triplex
- Fourplex
- Fiveplex
- Sixplex

- Townhouse
- Stacked Flats
- Courtyard Apartment
- Cottage Housing



Duplex

- Two units
- House-scale
- Side-by-side or "stacked"
- 1-2 stories

SHORELINE

- Shared or individual entrances
- Entries face the street









Triplex

- Three units
- House-scale
- Side-by-side or "stacked"
- 1-3 stories
- Shared or individual entries
- Entries face the street shore in Entries









Fourplex

- Four units
- Small to large house-scale
- Two units upstairs
- Two units downstairs
- 2-3 stories
- Shared or individual entries
- Entries face the street











Multiplex

- Five to twelve units
- Medium-sized building
- 2-3 stories
- Shared entryway
- Entry faces the street

Townhomes

- Three or more units
- Medium-sized building
- Side-by-side
- 2-3.5 stories
- Individual Entries
- Entries face the street









Courtyard Apartment

- Multiple attached units
- Medium sized building
- L shape, U shape or O shape
- 1-3 stories
- Shared or individual entryways
- Entryways face courtyard



Cottage

- Multiple units usually detached
- Small house scale
- 1-2 stories
- Individual entries with large front porch
- Entries face common open space

- Form responds to maximize development potential


Form (HB 1110)

Form-Based Regulations


- Tiers of residential development
