

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Edwin Pratt, was a prominent local civil rights leader, founding member of the Central Area Civil Rights Committee, and former Executive Director of the Seattle Urban League; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Pratt championed school desegregation, fair housing policies and practices, and ending discrimination in employment for Black Americans and others; and

WHEREAS, Edwin and Bettye Pratt were among the first African American residents to live in the Shoreline community when they purchased a home here in 1959; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Pratt, was a husband, father, and neighbor, and was active locally in his church and the Shoreline School District; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Pratt, was 38 years old when he was murdered at his Shoreline home over 50 years ago on January 26, 1969; and

WHEREAS, January 30, 1969 was declared a public day of mourning for Edwin Pratt and all flags were ordered to be flown at half-staff;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Christopher Roberts, Mayor of the City of Shoreline, on behalf of the Shoreline City Council, do hereby proclaim January 30, 2024, as

EDWIN T. PRATT DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

in the City of Shoreline and ask all residents to work together to participate in building a diverse and inclusive community with opportunities for all as Edwin Pratt had envisioned.
