Bicycle Registration

BICYCLE THEFT

Bicycle theft is an ongoing problem in the City of Shoreline. Many bicycles are left unattended and/or not locked. Many do not have serial numbers which makes the identification and recovery of lost or stolen



bicycles very difficult.

The Shoreline Police Bicycle Registration Program is one step you can take to improve your chances of getting your bicycle back if it is lost or stolen and recovered.

The mission of the program is to reduce bicycle theft and assist citizens in the recovery of lost or stolen bicycles. The program is offered to City of Shoreline residents only and it's free!

Register your bicycle free of charge!

- Bring picture ID or Driver's License to either the Shoreline Police Station or Neighborhood Center
- Serial Number - (if your bicycle does not have a serial number, engrave an identification number on it. You can call either of the Police Neighborhood Centers and make arrangements to borrow the engraver)
- Provide a description of the bicycle, including color, brand, and any particulars that identify your bicycle
- Upon registration, you will be given a sticker to place on the bicycle in a visible area
- If a registered bicycle is lost/stolen and recovered, our records will help us find the rightful owner

Where you can register your bicycle:

You can register your bicycle at either the Shoreline Police Department or one of the Police Neighborhood Centers.

What you can do to prevent bicycle theft :

- ◆ Secure your bicycle in a well-lit area
- ◆ Choose a lock that leaves as little space as possible between the lock and the bicycle
- ◆ Lock your bicycle to a secure object and in a visible area
- ◆ And now, the most important tip of all

ALWAYS LOCK YOUR BICYCLE!

Helpful Hint:

Take a picture of your bicycle to provide exact description of your bicycle in the event it is stolen.



Bicycle Safety



- Remember to wear a safety helmet at all times when riding your bicycle (If you do not have a bicycle helmet, call the Shoreline Fire Department at 206 533-6500 as they may have a program for discounted helmets)
- Walk across busy streets
- Always keep to the right
- Slow down and check traffic at all corners
- Keep your bicycle in good shape
- Never go between two cars
- Always let cars and people go first
- Avoid riding your bicycle at night
- Obey traffic signs and signals
- Wear bright clothes and put reflectors on your bike
- Check and oil your chain regularly
- Check your brakes

Note to Parents:

Teach your child (children) rules of the road.

Oversee their bicycle use until you are comfortable that they can handle a bicycle and observe those rules.
